

## Suggestions for short walks close to the Apartments

There are a couple of lovely walks close by to the apartments that are ideal for a 20 to 40 minute exercise. Ideal for stretching the legs or taking the dog around.

### Carnsnew Pool

You walk towards the viaduct and the end of the harbour. Follow harbour around to you are opposite to Penpol Terrace. Keep to the left of the harbour and not along the harbour edge. You will walk over rough ground but you will see Carnsnew Pool on your left. If you walk past the historic water way tunnels you can follow the pool all the way around doing a full circle back to the start. At the far end of the Pool you have great views of the estuary. You can also walk to the end of the 'Spit' from the water tunnels by walking straight instead of going around the pool. There is a bench at the end to sit on and take in the views of the entrance of the harbour and estuary. These views were made famous by the well known artist John Miller. You can see the house he lived in until his death just a few years ago. It is the taller, closer one on the side of the beach. Most of his paintings were of Lelant Bar and views to Godrevy Lighthouse, Carbis Bay and St Ives most of which you can see from the bench.

### The Plantation

Walk down Penpol Terrace under the viaduct and follow the road past Barclays Bank and back under the otherside of the viaduct. You will see a piece of open rough ground/car park on your left. Walk over this to the lane at the end. The small grass hill in front of you is the plantation. There are several paths that lead around it and a couple of benches to take in the views again. Because you are slightly elevated you have great views over the estuary and beach.

### King George V Memorial Walk

Turn right and walk around the corner past the pub. Just before you get to the petrol station cross the road and walk over the iron bridge. You pass the harbour master office on your right and just at the end you will see the start of the walk on your right. This walk has won many awards for Hayle because of its beautiful plants, some are even tropical because its so sheltered. Local people work hard maintaining it and preparing it for the village in Bloom yearly completion. Hayle often comes high in the National completion. The walk is about 2/3 of a mile long. You can see all sorts of birds if the water is out. It's a popular bird watching area.
